A global industry 500 years in the making

To truly appreciate Scotch, it helps to have an 1939 World War II reshaped the industry's history. 1494 The earliest documented record of distilling in Scotland. An entry in the Exchequer Rolls list "Eight bolls of malt to Friar John Cor wherewith to make agua vitae".

1644 The first official taxes on Scotch Whisky production are imposed causing a rise in illicit whisky distilling across Scotland.

1785 Scotland's Bard, Robert Burns writes the poem, 'Scotch Drink' which includes the line "O thou, my Muse! Guid auld Scotch drink!"

1823 The Excise Act is passed and illicit stills and smuggling of Scotch began to fall away. In their place, legal and licensed distilleries flourished, reaching a peak of over 300 in the years shortly after its enactment.

1831 Aeneas Coffey invents the Patent Still. This led to the production of lighter flavoured Grain Whisky which, when blended with more fiery malts, extended the appeal of Scotch Whisky.

1880 The phylloxera beetle devastates French vineyards. Scots are quick to take advantage, and Scotch Whisky replaced brandy as the spirit of choice.

1912 The Wine and Spirit Brand Association is formed. It became the Whisky Association in 1917 and then, in 1942, evolved again to become the Scotch Whisky Association as we know it today.

1920 Prohibition begins in the United States of America. The Federal Government make an exemption for whisky prescribed by a doctor for medicinal purposes.

- 1994 By the 500th anniversary of whisky production in Scotland, exports had reached £2 billion.
- **2009** The Scotch Whisky Regulations come into force. The rules set out how Scotch Whisky must be produced, labelled, packaged and advertised, helping to protect the reputation of Scotch.
- **2020** Scotch Whisky is the world's undisputed premier whisky. Approximately 42 bottles of Scotch are shipped from Scotland every second.
- More than 11,000 people are directly employed in the Scotch Whisky industry, 7000 of them in rural areas, providing vital employment and investment.
- Some 20 million casks lie maturing in warehouses throughout Scotland.
- More Scotch Whisky is enjoyed globally than the US, Canadian and Irish whisky brands combined.
- There are 133 Scotch Whisky distilleries operating across Scotland - more than at any time since World War II.
- Scotch Whisky accounts for around 20% of all UK food and drink exports.
- The largest Scotch Whisky market in the world by volume is France, while the largest by value is the USA.
- Scotch Whisky is shipped to all seven continents. In 2016 over 15,000 bottles were even exported to Antarctica!

There's a Scotch Whisky for everyone

Scotch Whisky is distilled spirit made from just three ingredients - cereals, water and yeast. It must be distilled and matured in Scotland for at least three years and bottled at a minimum alcohol strength of 40% ABV. With 133 operating distilleries across Scotland and growing - there are thousands of expressions of Scotch to suit every palate.

SINGLE MALT - Spirit distilled at a single distillery from water and malted barley without the addition of any additional cereals. Traditionally distilled in copper stills, handcrafted with every dent and rivet adding to the flavour profile. Single malt Scotch whisky must always be distilled, matured and bottled in Scotland.

SINGLE GRAIN - Grain whisky is distilled from a mixture of malted barley and other unsalted cereals such as wheat or maize. Distillation is carried out at a single site using the continuous patent process still process, invented in the early 19th century. The vast majority of grain whisky goes into Blended Scotch Whisky, but there are a growing number of Single Grain Scotch Whiskies to discover.

BLENDED SCOTCH WHISKY - Almost nine out of ten bottles of Scotch enjoyed around the world are Blended Scotch Whiskies - a blend of Single Grain and Single Malt whiskies. This category is the foundation of the industry and the art of the master blender, combining up to 60 different Scotch Whiskies, is a skill which is revered.

BLENDED MALT SCOTCH WHISKY - Blended Malts are a combination of two or more single malts. Unlike Blended Scotch, there is no Grain Whisky in Blended Malts.

BLENDED GRAIN SCOTCH WHISKY - Blended Grain Whiskies are a combination of two or more Single Grain Scotch Whiskies. Scotland is divided into five recognised Whisky producing regions, each with its own distinct character.

LOWLAND

Soft and smooth malts are characteristic of this region, offering a gentle, elegant palate reminiscent of grass, honeysuckle, cream, ginger, toffee, toast and cinnamon.

ISLAY

Islay is a magical island where the majority of its population are involved in whisky production. Famous for fiery, heavily peated whiskies.

CAMPBELTOWN

Campbeltown whiskies are varied and full of flavour. Hints of salt, smoke, fruit, vanilla and toffee, mingle in whiskies of robust and rich character.

HIGHLAND

This region, which also takes in the islands, has a huge diversity of flavours and characters. From lighter whiskies all the way through to salty coastal malts, the Highlands offer a Scotch for all palates.

SPEYSIDE

The most densely populated whisky region in the world, famous for fertile glens and, of course, the River Spey. Speyside whiskies are known for being frugal with peat and full of fruit.

Apple, pear, honey, vanilla and spices all have a role to play in expressions from this region, which are commonly matured in sherry casks.

Your guide to a traditional Scotch Whisky tasting

Scotch Whisky, by law, must be distilled and matured in oak casks in Scotland for at least three years - but many are matured for much longer.

Traditional whisky tastings are a great way of savouring this premium, crafted spirit and taking in all its complexity. There are many ways to conduct a tasting, but here we offer one way of helping people to discover Scotch in five simple steps using all five senses.

HEARING - You might think it's hard to hear Scotch Whisky - but the sound of a cork being taken out of a bottle is a sound that helps to toast marriages, celebrate births or mark business deals all over the world. Start your tasting here.

SIGHT - Hold your glass up and take a look - the colour of the whisky can give clues about its age and the type of cask used for maturation. New-make spirit prior to maturation is as clear as water, but after years maturing in the cask the spirit takes on the distinctive amber colour of Scotch.

SMELL - A master distiller will use the nose alone to make iudgements about a whisky. Don't worry if it proves difficult to describe - scientists have discovered a wide range of aromas. With a little practice, it will become easier.

To help, you can use the characteristics of the Scotch Whisky Regions to guide you in the right direction, and most expressions of Scotch Whisky now offer tasting notes on the packaging.

TASTE - Now sip the whisky and allow it to lie on the tongue and coat the sides of your mouth.

You might pick out different flavours to those you were aware of using your nose. Roll the spirit round so it comes into contact with all your taste buds, sweetness at the tip of your tongue, saltiness along the sides, dryness and bitterness at the back. The wonderful flavours will develop, unfolding in the mouth.

Try adding a little still, chilled water, then taste the whisky again. The water will reduce the alcohol content, and raise the temperature slightly, releasing more of the whisky's flavour. People often say this 'opens up' the Scotch.

TOUCH - Finally, ask yourself what flavours you are experiencing and how the whisky feels in your mouth. Does the flavour last or does it disappear quickly, is it oily or thick? This is the whisky's 'mouthfeel'.

It can be hard to describe the aroma and taste of Scotch Whisky - it's a wonderfully complex spirit. To help, the Scotch Whisky Research Institute have developed a flavour wheel which may help you during your tasting.

Cigars: An introduction

A cigar comes in all shapes and sizes, strengths, colours, flavours and prices. There are several countries which produce cigars across the world, each with different characteristics, however Cuban Cigars (Habanos) are considered to be the finest. You can think of them like wine, different regions, soils, temperatures, climates all add up to the variety in each

You can think of them like wine, different regions, soils, temperatures, climates all add up to the variety in each cigar. To be considered a cigar each one must have the following components.

WRAPPER: This is a thin leaf that dresses the exterior of the cigar, for appearance more than taste.

BINDER: Used for the construction of the cigar holding it all together.

FILLER: The main body of the cigar, where the majority of the character, aroma, flavour and strength can be found.



How do I know what to choose?

The ring gauge of the cigar is the size of its diameter. It is expressed in 64ths of an inch, so a 32-gauge ring is a half inch cigar and so on.

In terms of length of a cigar, they can measure from just 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (90mm) to over 9" (230mm).

Here's a few key points to note when finally deciding what cigar you would like...

- Heavy gauge cigars burn slowly and deliver a higher volume of smoke that covers the palate with a full mixture of flavours.
- Thinner cigars burn quicker and deliver a more concentrated flavour, giving a sharper taste.
- Longer cigars allow the smoke to cool slightly as it travels to the palate.
- Cigars are tactile products and for some people it's all about the feel in the hand and between the lips. Some smokers will be loyal to a certain style or brand of cigar.



Herman Upmann was a German banker who so loved Cuban cigars that he moved to Havana to set up as both a banker and a cigar producer. Although his bank closed in the early 1920's his cigars live on.
